History Walmart opened its first store in the municipality of Fajardo in 1992. The first Sam's Club opened in Bayamon in 1993. Two Sam's Club followed in 1994. The first Walmart supercenter opened in 2001 in the Municipality of Cayey. In 2003, the company acquired Supermercados Amigo, adding one of the Island's largest neighborhood supermarket chains to its portfolio. In 2008, the company opened two supercenters in the municipalities of Ponce and Canovanas and launched a new format (small neighborhood supermarket pilot program) called Super Ahorros. In April 2009, a new Super Ahorros was opened in the metro area of San Juan.

Awards In 2009, Walmart Puerto Rico received the following recognition:

Opportunity At Walmart Puerto Rico, we're proud of the positive economic impact we have on the community -- from the job opportunities we provide to our associates and the money we save to our customers. Walmart is the main private employer in Puerto Rico with more than 13,600 jobs. We help our customers save money and improve their quality of life with our \$4 generic prescriptions program.

Community In 2009, Walmart Puerto Rico contributed more than USD \$2 million to support local non-profit organizations. Stores and associates raised an additional \$1 million. Through community involvement programs, Walmart Puerto Rico has donated funds to more than 100 local non-profit organizations throughout the island.

Through strategic alliances with organizations such as the Women's Cardiologist Association, Puerto Rico Children's Hospital, and Center for Disease Control, among others, Walmart Puerto Rico has provided awareness campaigns to customers. Also, throughout the year, the local health department has provided free vaccines for children and adults, impacting thousands of customers in stores throughout the island.

"Dona tu Cambio" (Donate Your Change) was held in stores for the fifth consecutive year, raising more than USD \$100,000 for the local chapter of the Red Cross.

USD \$50,000 donation was given to the local chapter of Feeding America for a program which will help provide nutritious meals for children in risk of going hungry during the weekend. This donation was given to the organization during the launch of Walmart's local Food Donations program, which is part of the Zero Waste Program. Recently the company launched its signature holiday campaign, "Keep a Soul Warm during the Holidays", providing blankets and necessity kits to homeless people throughout the island.

Sustainability

Walmart Puerto Rico is committed to environmental protection and compliance with local regulations. This year, its operational energy efficiency initiatives saved more than 8.0M Kwh, equivalent to USD \$1.4 million. This year, Walmart Puerto Rico's recycling efforts diverted 77 percent of generated wastes from Puerto Rico's landfills.

The company also has a very proactive sustainability program, which includes alliances with government agencies, community organizations, schools and suppliers. Some of those partners include the Puerto Rico Electric Power Authority, the Puerto Rico Aqueduct and Sewer Administration, the Puerto Rico Solid Waste Authority, the Puerto Rico Department of Education, the Puerto Rico Economic Development Bank, Yo Limpio a Puerto Rico, the Puerto Rico Conservation Trust, Scuba Dogs, San Juan Bay Estuary among others.

This year Walmart Puerto Rico launched the Carraizo Lake Cleaning activity in which Walmart associates, NGOs and government entities cleaned the most important water source of the metropolitan area.

In alliance with the local Solid Waste Authority and Sony Puerto Rico, a television recycling campaign was held in six stores and helped to recover 112,540 lbs. or six tons of recyclable material.

Walmart Puerto Rico launched a food donations pilot in four stores and because of its success, the company has expanded the program to 22 stores and has been able to donate more than 42,000 lbs. or 21 tons of dry groceries for the local Feeding America chapter. With this program, Walmart Puerto Rico has become the first company to give reoccurring donations to the food bank.

Also, the company created a local farmer's development program, "Walmart Siembra el Desarrollo del Pais," in alliance with government agencies and non government organizations, to increase the consumption of local produce and create new jobs in the agricultural sector.

During 2009, Walmart Puerto Rico held its first Sustainability Forum and created a Sustainability Council, launched its first Energy Innovation Contest, established a fashionable reusable bag program in alliance with Ponce Art Museum and local artists, and implemented a plastic bags recycling program.
