About the Campaign

The "Walmart Gives Back" holiday giving campaign provides \$32 million in monetary and in-kind donations to charitable organizations across the U.S. The campaign includes contributions to Feeding America and Meals On Wheels Association of America as part of an effort to eradicate hunger in America.

Walmart's holiday giving will also happen at the local level with more than \$24 million donated from the Walmart Foundation to nonprofits in the communities where Walmart's 4,000 stores and clubs are located. Walmart Gives Back...Hunger Relief

- Feeding America: The Walmart Foundation is donating 35 refrigerator food trucks to Feeding America, the nation's largest hunger relief agency. The trucks will be filled with Great Value-branded foods and fresh apples and will be delivered to food banks in select markets across the nation.
 - Food Delivered: Feeding America estimates the refrigerator food trucks will enable the food banks to transport up to 52.5 million pounds of food, the equivalent of 41 million additional meals, per year.
