

At a Glance: Walmart Gives Back Campaign

About the Campaign

The "Walmart Gives Back" holiday giving campaign provides \$32 million in monetary and in-kind donations to charitable organizations across the United States. The campaign includes contributions to Feeding America, Meals On Wheels Association of America, Operation Homefront and Wreaths Across America as part of a holiday giving initiative focused on providing hunger relief and support for military families this holiday season.

Walmart Gives Back...Support for Military Families and Veterans

- **Operation Homefront Toy Shops:** On Friday, Dec. 4, more than 10,000 military children will receive toys and books this holiday season – gifts made possible by a \$1.1 million donation by Walmart. Spouses of deployed military personnel will shop for free at Operation Homefront toy shops. The toy shop locations were selected using Pentagon reports identifying areas where military personnel deployment is highest.

Walmart Gives Back...Hunger Relief

- **Feeding America:** The Walmart Foundation donated 35 refrigerated food trucks to Feeding America, the nation's largest hunger relief agency. The trucks were filled with Great Value-branded foods and fresh apples and were delivered to food banks in markets across the nation.
 - **Food Delivered:** Feeding America estimates the refrigerated food trucks will enable the food banks to transport up to 52.5 million pounds of food – the equivalent of 41 million additional meals per year.
